## ▶ Insight and understanding of people and place



### Active Lives Year 3 data

at county and district level produced and released. This was circulated across the county and districts and has helped us and our partners to be more insight led in our work

**Insight and learning sections** have been created on the website, designed as a resource hub and there were **1000+** visits to these pages over the year

Creation and dissemination of the **'Understanding People and Physical Activity'** resource focusing on the motivations and barriers to becoming physically active for people within our priority groups. The document has been used to support funding bids and marketing and engaging with target audiences



**1144** children, parents and teachers in Derbyshire schools completed the **Active Lives Children and Young People Survey**.

The Year 1 survey results were collated, shared and used to help plan future young people work

## ▶ A Strong System

The Derbyshire **Asset Based Learning Network** was established to develop understanding and share learning of place-based work in the county



**Active Fostering** work was developed in collaboration with **Derbyshire County Council** and other local authorities to enable children in care and their carers to access physical activity opportunities. This has led to a network of organisations working together to ensure that activity provision is insight led

The **Planning and health System Leaders Group** has been established to develop an integrated health and planning process and working to bring extra capacity to the system

**170** people attended and feedback shows an NPS score of **92**, an increase from **52** last year which indicates it was received positively



## ▶ Right environment, opportunities

2019 **SECONDARY PE, SPORT & PHYSICAL ACTIVITY CONFERENCE**

**43** teachers attended the **Secondary PE and Sport Conference**. The event covered all aspects of delivering a diverse PE and mental wellbeing offer into the curriculum

**28 new provisions** have been funded through the **Young People's Fund**, designed to reach young people not regularly taking part in sport or physical activity, using innovative ways to get young people active

**Girls Active** Programme events have been hosted for **49** young people from six secondary schools to help equip, enable and empower them to shape the PE offer in their schools in a peer-led manner



**Derbyshire School Games** were held in the summer, bringing together **582** young people from primary, secondary and special schools across Derbyshire. **57 schools** participated in **10 activities** and **over 150 young people** volunteered as **Young Leaders**

## ▶ Investment



**£101,204** of investment leveraged into Derbyshire through supporting community organisations with funding applications **dedicated to help communities to become or remain active and improve health and wellbeing outcomes**

**£109k** investment from **Sport England** was secured to support schools to open their facilities outside of the school day for use by the local community



Supported **Derbyshire County Council** with the delivery of their action grants programme, awarding **£50,435** to **106** organisations to invest in physical activity provision

A **£150k GOGA (Get Out Get Active)** funding bid was successful in Amber Valley that supports disabled and non-disabled people to enjoy being active together. The work will be led by **Amber Valley Borough Council** and the funding over three years will allow them to enhance their existing work for this community

**£75k** to support ongoing 'Girls Active' work in schools across Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire for out of school offers for non-sporty girls

Awarded **£50k** for the development of **Voluntary Community Sector (VCS)** work to build relationships locally and nationally to better understand how to support sustainable VCS activities across Derbyshire

**£75k** of **Sport England** funding was awarded to a partnership in Bolsover to land the **We are Undeatable** campaign locally. **North East Derbyshire Healthcare Federation** are leading on this work to deliver a workforce focused on enabling those with a long term condition (LTC) to become or remain active

Box Instructor training funded for **18 Derbyshire leaders** to meet community needs

## ▶ Diverse, skilled workforce

**£80,000** per year has been secured from **Sport England** for developing the workforce across the county, running from April 2019 to March 2021

Hosted the **Active Design Conference** which focused on how physical activity and health could and should be integrated in the planning process. **91** colleagues attended

Facilitated delivery of an **Inclusive Activity Programme (IAP)** training course to **12** university students

**8 teachers** from Derbyshire Secondary schools attended the **Girls Active Teacher Training**

**A Rough Guide to Planning for Non-Planners'** training event was held to provide the physical activity sector with a better understanding of the planning system. Over **40** partners attended

Delivered **2 School Governor and School Business Manager briefings** to **40** attendees. The briefings were designed to inform how to effectively utilize the **Primary PE and Sport Premium**

Delivered **2 safeguarding courses** and **first aid courses** to **23** attendees. **Reflective Practice** training delivered to **30** colleagues across the county

**Talking Insights** Session held to share learning around inclusive activity **30** people attended

Launched **Coach Core Derbyshire** for **17** apprentices within **11** organisations across the county ranging from sports clubs to community organisations

**Coach bursary funding** Coach bursary funding was launched and awarded **£24,243.50** to coaches to develop their skills. Some this funding was allocated to work in priority places to build capacity and develop the workforce.

A podcast has been recorded and shared on inclusive activity. The aim of the podcasts is to draw out key learning from these work areas. So far, the podcast has been downloaded a total of **44** times
