Approximately **£600k** has been accessed to support the Towards an active Derbyshire work to get more people in the City and County active

Supported **SHIFT** to secure over **£300k** from **Sport England** for their **Active4Life** programme. A two-year initiative to build active communities in 3 places across Derbyshire.

 Supported **DSSA** to secure **£24,000** from **Derbyshire Public Health** towards the work of the **Derbyshire Schools' Sports Association**.

Secured **£146,000** from **Derbyshire County Council Public Health** for local innovation work supporting place based work across priority areas in the County.

## workforce

Established **Coach Core Apprenticeship Programme** in partnership with the Royal Foundation and other local

partners, targeting care leavers and those not in Education, training or employment (NEETs). 19 apprenticeships hosted in schools, community groups, local authorities and professional clubs.



Relaunched **Derbyshire Coach Bursary Scheme** with **£24,000** to support the development of coaches and leaders.

## strong system

Worked collaboratively in each locality with **Public Health, Local Authority and other partners** to strengthen local activity partnership working, identifying people and priority places for future engagement to reduce inactivity.

Over **70** individuals attended the first 'Towards an Active Derbyshire' network event designed to share learning on place-based work and understand how best to learn together.



## insight

Up to date data packs produced and shared with each local authority in Derbyshire and made available on the **Active Derbyshire website**. These packs include data on physical activity levels, health and demographic data, and will help APT and partners to determine those in greatest need at a local level.



Over **70** people from over **40** different organisations attended a Disability Insight Conference held on 20 March 2019. The conference helped connect people from different sectors and allowed them to find out about and discuss the opportunities available to people with limiting illnesses and long-term conditions.



Ran a workshop at the **Derbyshire Fostering Conference** to gather insight on the physical activity behaviours of children in care and their carers, leading to attendance at a Children in Care Council to gain further insight on behaviours and support required.

Over **1000** young people in total, across 11 sports, as participants or volunteer leaders, took part in the level 3 School Games event on 9th July 18.

Provided support to the FA and Football Foundation by facilitating connections to community partners across the county, to enable the completion of 9 insight led Local Football Facility Plans across Derbyshire.



Building on the support document distributed last year 'Primary PE and Sport Premium Guide 2017-2018, this year 'Effective use of the Primary PE and Sport Premium – Good Practice Examples' booklet has been produced.

All schools received a hard copy and copies can be downloaded from the Active Derbyshire website.

This document received very positive feedback from national partners, Sport England and Youth Sports Trust.

Established a **Health and Planning System Leaders Group** to promote Active Design and good practice across the county.



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Working collaboratively with **Derbyshire Active Schools Network** and **Derby County Community Trust**, APT staff played a key role in shaping the **Derbyshire Active Schools Conference 'Creating a Culture of Active, Healthy Learners'** on 24th January 2019.



The conference was over-subscribed and feedback was extremely positive.

More than **35,000** pupils from schools across Derbyshire took part in **Stand Up Derbyshire Day**, which saw them getting active for at least 50 per cent of the school day. Organised by the Derbyshire Active Schools Network, **Stand Up Derbyshire Day** was held on Friday, September 28
